

VIZORDESK - GLOBAL PRIVACY POLICY

VizorDesk is highly committed to protecting your privacy and strictly adhering to global data protection regulations. This document outlines how we handle the minimal data required to provision our digital intelligence software and cloud infrastructure.

1. Data Collection & Processing

To ensure immediate and secure node allocation, we collect only strictly necessary operational data, including your email address, IP address, and Whop account identifier. We do NOT process, see, or store your credit card information. All financial data is encrypted and handled directly by Stripe.

2. System Telemetry & Usage Analytics

In order to maintain system performance, optimize latency, and improve user experience, VizorDesk may collect anonymous telemetry and usage data (e.g., session durations, interface interactions). This data contains no personally identifiable financial information and is used strictly for internal engineering, infrastructure calibration, and security monitoring.

3. Global Regulatory Compliance

Our data practices are designed to comply with the strictest international laws:

- **Europe & UK (GDPR):** We process data strictly for contract fulfillment. You maintain the right to access, rectify, or request the erasure of your personal data.
- **United States (CCPA/CPRA):** VizorDesk has a strict zero-tolerance policy for data brokering. We do NOT sell, rent, or trade your personal information to any third parties or marketing agencies under any circumstances.
- **Turkey (KVKK):** Personal data is processed in strict accordance with the Law No. 6698 on the Protection of Personal Data. Information is used exclusively for the establishment and performance of the digital service contract and fraud prevention.

4. Data Security & Fraud Prevention

Your data is used to secure our network infrastructure and prevent unauthorized access. In the event of a fraudulent chargeback attempt or malicious network activity, connection logs (including IP addresses) may be shared with payment processors (Stripe) and relevant financial institutions as legal evidence to resolve disputes.
